## Uniform reminders and indoor shoes policy

Please remember we have a uniform policy for PE kits. As we are allowing children to come dressed in PE kits, on the days they have PE it seem as if for some the PE uniform has gone a bit by the wayside recently.

Our uniform for PE for ALL children is red tshirt, blue shorts, indoor plimsolls or trainers, and school track suit. All of this can be bought on through Emblematics, details on the website.

Designer gear , logo t shirts , football tops of various designs etc etc are NOT allowed . Please help us by supporting our uniform policy.

Suitable footwear should be worn every day—ie black school shoes, not trainers or fashion boots/shoes.

As there will still be ground works being carried out around the site after we move in, we are considering an indoor shoe policy for pupils. This will mean PLIMSOLLS for indoor use and children can change into these once they arrive in the classrooms. There will be a lot of mud around and obviously we want to keep our new (mainly carpeted) school clean!

If your child doesn't have a pair of plimsolls currently, please consider buying them ready for next term.

# NATIONAL TUTORING

PROGRAMME.

We will shortly be contacting parents/carers of some children who we have identified may benefit from the National Tutoring Programme. This is online tuition which is provided with government funding to help children 'catch up' with lost learning due to the impact of Covid and school closures. We will also be supporting pupils in school but some will be able to access 15 sessions of online tutoring at home over the Summer term. We expect more funding will allow even more children to take part in the Autumn term.
