On the 1st October, Year 5 enjoyed working with the sculptor Andrew McKeown. You may have seen some of his work along the Seaham coast! The children spent the day designing mining tokens and creating mining art work. Children carved some of the token designs into sand blocks, and we all watched them being cast from pewter. Some of the children then worked on cleaning up the tokens and were really impressed with the results. It was great to have a visitor in school to give the children a new experience!









Year 6 pupils had their very own 'evacuation' experience at Beamish this half term as part of our World War Two history topic, finding out what jobs around the farm they would have to do as part of 'the war effort' if they had to move away from home. Feeding the animals, collecting eggs and mucking out the animals were just some of the duties they would have had to help out with. We wrote postcards back to our families whilst sat around the hearth at Home Farm and then enjoyed a tour around the different areas Beamish had to offer: journeys on old-fashioned transport, watching boiled sweets being made, interacting with the 'characters' and much more.

The children had a fantastic time finding out what life would have been like during the various eras and thoroughly enjoyed the impromptu lesson by Victorian teacher, 'Master Bell', on the importance of behaving in class. A grand day out was had by all!

Segedunum

Year 4 had an exciting start to the week with a trip to 'Segedunum' to see the remains of the Roman Fort. We had a perfect view of the site from the looking tower and then spent plenty of time exploring the different buildings that



were used by the Romans. The children were fascinated by the cavalry and infantry soldier's barracks, the commanding officer's house and the hospital wing. In the afternoon, we were transported into the past and became honorary auxiliary soldiers stationed in Segedunum Fort. We were able to handle armour and weapons, and feel the full extent of the weight the soldiers had to carry...an extra 5 stone...and they even had to train to swim with all their kit on! A fabulous day.
