WALK TO SCHOOL-'WOW'

On Friday 25th March, we had a visitor present assembly– Becca from Living Streets. She reminded us about WOW—Walk Once a Week-which is a scheme which encourages children to walk to school once per week or use active travel—bike, scooter, wheeling or 'park and stride'. If we can do this at least once per week for 4 weeks the children get a badge. There are 12 badges to collect. The children were very good at
